New Integrated Health Care Facility

Defence Minister, Harjit S. Sajjan, and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of National Defence, Jean Rioux, visited the construction site of the future Health Services Centre at the Saint-Jean Garrison. The 7,141-m² health care facility will provide CAF members with integrated medical, dental, physiotherapeutic and mental health services at a single location. Valued at \$48.2 million, the project is expected to generate over 110 jobs during the construction period, and provide numerous economic opportunities for the local community.

Official Opening of Tactical Armoured Patrol Vehicle (TAPV)

Defence Minister Harjit S. Sajjan highlighted infrastructure investments at 4th Canadian Division Support Base Petawawa with a ribbon-cutting ceremony for a new Tactical Armoured Patrol Vehicle (TAPV) facility. The 6,800-m² facility will house 59 TAPVs and provides 11 maintenance bays for vehicles and equipment, as well as classrooms. This project will provide our personnel with modern facilities that are essential to daily operations and training. The \$26-million project was completed on time and on budget and created approximately 120 jobs during construction.

Canadian Special Operations Regiment (CSOR) complex

Defence Minister Harjit S. Sajjan highlighted infrastructure investments at 4th Canadian Division Support Base (4 CDSB) Petawawa a new Canadian Special Operations Regiment (CSOR) complex.

The CSOR complex project represents a \$319-million investment in defence infrastructure and numerous economic development opportunities for local businesses and communities. More than 80 sub-contracts will be tendered through this project, creating an estimated 1,300 jobs during the construction phase.

The 10-building complex will bring previously dispersed CSOR units together, allowing for increased collaboration and efficiency while providing the regiment with modern operational space, training facilities, vehicle maintenance areas, warehouses and medical facilities. CSOR provides the Canadian Special Operations Forces Command with a versatile, multi-mission force, capable of delivering tactical to strategic-level special operational outcomes.

Equipment Fielding Coordination Centre

The Equipment Fielding Coordination Centre (EFCC) is a 1222 m² building with an additional 3798 m² of exterior parking space. The EFCC provides 2 Area Support Unit Petawawa with much needed infrastructure that includes office, maintenance, storage, training, and parking space. This building will provide suitable, sustainable infrastructure for the operational requirements of units.

Medium-to-Heavy Lift Helicopter Training Accommodations

The first of the training accommodation facilities will provide 97 rooms of additional accommodations for CFB Petawawa to alleviate accommodation shortages at the base. The building is based on the “Yukon Lodge” prototype design used for accommodations buildings at CFB Wainwright, Trenton, and Kingston.

The second accommodations facility will provide 99 additional accommodation rooms to support the Medium-to-Heavy Lift Helicopter program. This building will also be based on the “Yukon Lodge” prototype design used for accommodations buildings at CFB Wainwright, Trenton, and Kingston.

This new building, 443.46 m², will house the nine Regional Element staff of the JPSU Eastern Ontario Region who have been working in a temporary location since 2009. As the Regional Element for all the Integrated Personnel Support Centres for Eastern Ontario Region, including Petawawa, Ottawa, Trenton, Kingston, and Petawawa-Satellite North Bay, this new building will allow staff to provide the necessary support for ill and injured Canadian Forces personnel, former personnel, their families and the families of the deceased.

Construction of a New Hangar to Chinooks

The Honourable Laurie Hawn, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of National Defence, on behalf of the Honourable Peter MacKay, Minister of National Defence, today attended the sod turning ceremony for the construction of a new hangar to house 15 CF-147F Chinook helicopters at CFB Petawawa. Accompanying

Parliamentary Secretary Hawn at the event was Cheryl Gallant, Member of Parliament for Renfrew-Nipissing-Pembroke.

“State-of-the-art equipment is essential to the effectiveness of a modern military, but we must ensure we have the proper support to maintain these impressive machines,” said Parliamentary Secretary Hawn. “This new hangar will play a vital role in the future of CFB Petawawa by providing the support it needs to house Canada’s new fleet of CH-147 Chinook helicopters.”

This ceremony follows the Minister MacKay’s recent announcement of a contract award of \$134.8 million to EllisDon Corporation for the construction of the new hangar in October 2010.

The new 50,000m² hangar will consist of five main components including 1st and 2nd line maintenance bays, CAE and Boeing training schools, a backshop and warehouse, and a Department of National Defence Command Suite.
