## **STAFF REPORTS**

1. <u>PW-25-2016 – Update on the request to install a flashing beacon at Black Bay Road</u> and Petawawa Boulevard

Daniel Scissons, CAO/Clerk, presented the report. The County has installed an oversized stop sign and a stop ahead sign, however, the response from the County's Director of Public Works, indicates that the installation of a flashing light is not warranted. Councillor Lemay requested to provide Council with an overview of presentation material which supported the installation request. During Councillor Lemay's presentation, she referenced lighting at the intersection of Petawawa Boulevard and Black Bay Road as well as the removal of the railway tracks as

concerns affecting this intersection specifically. Mayor Sweet proposed that a review of this matter be conducted. The examination should include the possibility of enhanced street lighting, the Town installing the flashing beacon of their own accord, and any legal implications resulting therefrom. Staff will report findings back to Council.
