PRESENTATIONS

1. <u>Delegation - Wayne Bando - Road Condition Inventory Report - Pitzner Road</u>

Wayne Bando addressed Council to express his repeated desire to have a hard, all weather surface installed for 1 km on Pitzner Road. Reference to By-law 160/00 was discussed, as was the recent Road Condition report, PW-18-2016, which was reviewed at the July 25th Council-in-Committee meeting. Mr. Bando indicated that while a noted decrease in the condition of the roads, as reported in the press, is factual, the direness of the situation has been overstated, and cited that there are many municipalities facing such challenges. Mr. Bando suggested that a change in asset management strategies should be considered. Mr. Bando further addressed concerns about Town subdivision development and weather management considerations, specifically citing Winston Avenue.

Mayor Sweet conceded that the Road Condition report did indeed show a decrease in Road Condition rating from 7 to 5.6 but indicated that the full Infrastructure Study would not be complete until 2017. The complete Infrastructure Study would provide Council with more definitive direction on asset priorities. Mayor Sweet noted that the Province of Ontario has yet to sign off on the Infrastructure Fund and without availability to additional funding some shovel ready projects will be placed on hold, again. With respect to concerns over weather control management in subdivisions, Mayor Sweet conceded that Council is aware of these issues and is exploring options to address concerns. Mayor Sweet noted that developers are charged for deficiencies assumed by the Town and not passed to the taxpayer.

2. By-law 1067/16 - being a By-law to Stop Up and Sell a portion of Public Highway

Karen Cronier, Planning Coordinator, provided an overview of the report. Ms. Cronier reported that a survey of 20 Albert Street, conducted by the Owner, Mr. Eschak, revealed significant encroachment onto Town property. As Mr. Eschak intends to increase the number of dwelling units at this location a request to purchase the unopened road allowance and rezone said section came before Council. Council approved the request to rezone the unopened road allowance with intention to sell the property to Mr. Eschak. Council further reviewed and accepted a site plan that allowed for the construction of two additional basement units within the existing building. A public meeting occurred on June 20th, 2016, the 440 square metres of road allowance was rezoned to R3-E10 and the appeal period lapsed on July 12, 2016 with no appeals. The revised zoning is in full effect. Notification for stop up and sale of the unopened road allowance was conducted according to By-law 238/2003 and notification was delivered to the adjacent property owner. The Town was notified by Hydro One Networks Inc. that an easement would be required for the existing utility pole, currently located on the unopened road allowance. In addition, one resident had a general inquiry and another resident requested clarification on the sale process. Ms. Cronier noted that survey and appraisal of the unopened road allowance has been completed, and all expenses associated with this file are assumed by Mr. Eschak. A by-law will be required to facilitate the sale of subject lands to Mr. Eschak.
