## 1. 2016 Ontario Senior of the Year Award, Victor Jackson

# 2. <u>Barrier Free Report and Work Plan, Sheila Clarke, Chair, Petawawa Accessibility</u> Advisory Committee (PAAC)

Mayor Sweet welcomed Sheila Clarke, Chair of the Petawawa Accessibility Advisory Committee (PAAC), to make her presentation on the results of the Barrier Free audit on municipal buildings and parks. Mrs. Clarke provided an overview of the Barrier Free audit, noting the highlights and deficiencies, which were categorized into short, medium and long term priorities. Mrs. Clarke noted the successful accessibility modifications taking place at the Municipal Office and some of the area public parks. Deficiencies in signage, orientation cues for the blind and visually impaired as well as environmental issues were noted as short term priorities which the PAAC will continue to work towards rectifying with the aid of Council and staff. The work plan highlighted continued awareness and communication efforts along with the research and development of a customer service training program.

Mayor Sweet thanked Mrs. Clarke for her presentation and noted that a number of the Committee initiatives resulting from the Barrier Free audit could be addressed. Mayor Sweet thanked all of the PAAC members for their community service.
