PUBLIC MEETINGS

1. Zoning By-law Amendment (from "Extractive Industrial" to "Residential One"; from "Rural-Exception Ten" to "Residential One"; from "Rural-Exception Eleven" to "Rural"; from "Extractive Industrial Reserve" to "Rural"; and from "Extractive Industrial" to "Rural"), Part of Lots 12 to 15, Concession 7, Rantz Rd

The Public Meeting was opened by the Deputy Mayor at 6:35 p.m. Karen Cronier, Planning Coordinator, advised that the Notice of Public Meeting had been provided as required under the Planning Act. The Town received written correspondence from Ontario Power Generation who had no concerns regarding the amendment.

Ms. Cronier explained the purpose of the amendment is to rezone lands which are the site of a former aggregate extraction operation which has been rehabilitated and the extraction licence surrendered. The subject lands are designated Rural in the Official Plan and no further extraction of aggregates will occur. The amendment is also required to permit the creation of three new residential lots, being the severed lands in severance applications B114/14(1), B115/14(2), and B116/14(3). The effect of the amendment is to rezone the subject lands from Extractive Industrial (EM) to Residential One (R1); from Rural-Exception Ten (RU-E10) to Residential One (R1); from Rural-Exception Eleven (RU-E11) to Rural (RU); from Extractive Industrial Reserve (EMR) to Rural (RU); and from Extractive Industrial (EM) to Rural (RU). All other provisions of the Zoning By-law would apply.

Deputy Mayor Mohns asked to hear comments from members of the public. No one from the public came forward to speak for or against the application.

Ms. Cronier then explained the appeal process to those present in the audience.

Deputy Mayor Mohns thanked all for attending the meeting and declared the Public Meeting closed at 6:37 p.m.
