


Petawawa's population has grown **19%** between 2001 and 2016.




Demographic Portrait – Age Structure

Median Age Comparators



Demographic Portrait – Household Income




Average Household income in Petawawa increased from \$76,392 in 2011 to \$86,048 in 2016. It is projected that Petawawa's strong household earnings are affected by the military presence in the area. A stable healthy income generally indicates a strong quality of life and disposable incomes which likely have a positive effect on local commerce.

The majority of dwelling types in Petawawa are single detached homes. The average dwelling value in Petawawa continues to rise while area comparators have some relatively static value increase. This could result in potential homeowners seeking to purchase in more competitive local areas.

The average rental rate in 2016 for Petawawa was \$866, Pembroke was \$827 and Renfrew County was \$838.



Demographic Portrait – Educational Profile






The top educational categories are:

Demographic Portrait – Unemployment Rate







Petawawa has high employment in the public administration (52%) in a local quotients (LQ) evaluation it is noted that Petawawa, relative to the province, leads in the following industries:






Demographic Portrait – Labour Force by Industry Sub-Sector




There is strong opportunity for entrepreneurial development in Petawawa as self employment details show low volume and diversity of fields are limited.

Labour Force Population aged 15 years and over by occupation in Petawawa, 2011 & 2016



Top Employment Occupations in Petawawa, 2011




Commuting Patterns where Petawawa is
