**COUNCILLOR REPORTS**

Mayor Bob Sweet recognized the nominees and finalists for the 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Awards gala for the Upper Ottawa Valley Chamber of Commerce (UOVCC) Annual Business Achievement Awards and the Ottawa Valley Tourist Association (OVTA) 2018 Ottawa Valley Tourism Awards. On behalf of Council and staff, Mayor Sweet extended congratulations to the Hyska's team at Hyska's Your Independent Grocer, recipient of the Large Business of the Year Achievement Award given by the UOVCC on April 28<sup>th</sup>. Petawawa was well represented by fellow nominees John A. Butler Photography in the Creative Services category, Northern Credit Union in the Professional Services award, Valour JK-12 School in the Excellence in Education division and Jessica Videto, Vice President of Operations for Quality Inn and Suites Petawawa in the Employee of the Year category. Mayor Sweet congratulated all the nominees on their outstanding work and service provided for their respective organizations.

Mayor Sweet reported the Town of Petawawa gratefully accepted a new award, under the category of Excellence in Tourism, Events or Promoting Award for The Upper Ottawa River Race and Paddle Fest. This now annual event is a passion project spearheaded by our enthusiastic team at Parks and Recreation in collaboration with the City of Pembroke. This event was also the successful recipient of the Special Event of the Year category for the 2018 Ottawa Valley Tourism Awards. Mayor Sweet extended thanks to both the UOVCC and the OVTA for their support and promotion of Petawawa businesses through their award recognition programs.

Mayor Sweet reported he attended the Petawawa Sports and Entertainment Hall of Fame ribbon cutting ceremony on April 26<sup>th</sup>, the Showcase opening ceremony on April 27<sup>th</sup>, the UOVCC Awards Gala on April 28<sup>th</sup>, and the Ontario Small Urban Municipalities (OSUM) Conference in Niagara Falls May 2<sup>nd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup>.

Councillor Gary Serviss reported he attended Showcase and fielded questions from the public regarding the proposed Active Transportation Plan. Councillor Serviss recognized the inaugural six inductees into the Petawawa Sports and Entertainment Hall of Fame: Willard Mohns and Fred Molson in the builder category, Roy Giesebrecht and Ray Sheppard in the sports category, and Jason Blaine and Joshua Hopkins in the entertainment category. The induction ceremony will be held on June 15<sup>th</sup> at the Petawawa Civic Centre, tickets will be available for \$5.00 at the Parks and Recreation Department and the Petawawa Public Library.

Councillor Murray Rutz reported he attended a Festival Hall Committee meeting on April 19<sup>th</sup>, the Petawawa Sports and Entertainment Hall of Fame ribbon cutting on April 26<sup>th</sup>, Showcase, and the Bicycle Rodeo on May 5<sup>th</sup>.

Councillor Treena Lemay reported she participated in Showcase and commented it was very well attended. Councillor Lemay reported she will be representing the Town at the 50<sup>th</sup> annual memorial service at Wegner Point on May 13<sup>th</sup> to honour and remember those fallen soldiers who tragically drowned during a parachute drop training exercise. Councillor Lemay recognized Mr. Dennis Stowe for organizing the annual memorial service.

Deputy Mayor Tom Mohns reminded residents of the Ottawa Valley Waste Recovery Centre's Environmental Day on May 12<sup>th</sup> at the Petawawa Civic Centre from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. where hazardous or special waste and electronic waste can be disposed of at no charge. Deputy Mayor Mohns reported leaf and yard waste will be picked up the week of May 20<sup>th</sup> on your regular collection day, and large item collection will occur the week of May 27<sup>th</sup> on your regular collection day. Large items should not be placed out for pick up until May 27<sup>th</sup>. Deputy Mayor Mohns suggested residents should check their collection schedule to ensure they are putting out allowable items for pick up.

Councillor Theresa Sabourin reported she attended a Pembroke and Area Airport Commission meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup>, the Petawawa Sports and Entertainment Hall of Fame ribbon cutting on April 26<sup>th</sup>, and Showcase on April 27<sup>th</sup>. Councillor Sabourin congratulated the organizers of the Bicycle Rodeo on another successful event for local youth. Councillor Sabourin recognized local residents Charlotte Penny and Donna Ryan for cleaning up along the side of Doran Road.

Councillor James Carmody reported he attended a Pembroke and Area Airport Commission meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup>. Councillor Carmody also commented on how well attended Showcase was and how engaged residents were regarding the Active Transportation Plan.


