CORRESPONDENCE

1. Pembroke & Area Airport Commission 2019 Budget

Councillor Tom Mohns presented the Pembroke & Area Airport Commission budget. Councillor Mohns indicated the 2018 surplus amount of \$186,820 will be put into

general reserves and could be put towards the future replacement of the fuel tanks. Councillor Mohns explained the fuel tanks will be inspected this year by a contractor, who will then provide a report to the Commission regarding the status of the fuel tanks. After the report is received, the Commission will then need to decide if it warrants fuel tank replacement. It is estimated at this time that it could cost upwards of \$350,000 to replace the tanks. The Commission would need to issue a request for proposal or tender to have the tanks replaced.

Councillor Tom Mohns reported he spoke during the last meeting of the Pembroke & Area Airport Commission and reported the Town would consider funding for the fuel tank replacement during its budget deliberations in 2020, following the results of the inspection report of the fuel tanks. Direction was not given from the Commission at its last meeting to request funding from its partner municipalities at this time for the replacement of the fuel tanks.
