1. <u>County of Renfrew's Canadian Pacific Abandoned Rail Corridor Grey County and Hastings County Tour – Mayor Bob Sweet</u>

Mayor Bob Sweet, acting as Chair of the County's Development and Property Committee, and Paul Moreau, Director of Development & Property for the County of Renfrew, provided a presentation to Council regarding the recent tour of the Canadian Pacific Abandoned Rail Corridor in Grey County and Hastings County. The County conducted the tour to view the trails that the municipalities purchased from CP Rail and to learn how they operate the trails as well as the processes they went through to purchase the property. The County is considering purchasing a portion of the abandoned rail line from Smiths Falls to Mattawa that is approximately 302 km in length, to be used as a multi-use trail and to promote tourism. Mayor Sweet reported that the County hopes to have an agreement in principle to purchase the property by summer 2015.
