1. <u>Highway 17 Expansion – Kathryn E. Moore, Regional Director, Ministry of Transportation</u>

Mayor Sweet provided an update to Council regarding the Town's request to four-lane Highway 17 eastward from North Renfrew to meet westward construction. Mayor Sweet highlighted Garrison Petawawa and Canadian Nuclear Laboratories, both federal institutions which employ over 10,000 people and generate significant commuter traffic. Mayor Sweet indicated the Federal Government has a role to play in this situation as well as the Provincial Government. The Town of Petawawa will continue to press this situation with both levels of government. The item of correspondence was received for information.
