# 4. <u>PL-18-17 – Zoning By-law Amendment, H&H Construction, Part Shoreline Road Allowance along E/S Petawawa River, in front of Lot 19, Concession 8, 49 Portage Road, Petawawa</u>

### 3. PW-12-2017 – Private Water Service for 2 Biesenthal Road

David Unrau presented the report. Mr. Unrau explained that the property owner of 2 Biesenthal Road, a four unit apartment building, has submitted a request to connect to municipal water via the Petawawa Boulevard water main, crossing County of Renfrew lands, including the Algonquin Trail.

Council discussed when the water system was initially installed in the Township decades ago, those properties within the water service area paid a local improvement charge which supported the cost of the system installation. If this resident were to connect to the water system, he would be benefitting without having had contributed to the original construction.

Council also discussed what would happen if other homeowners along Biesenthal Road wanted to connect to the water system. Currently there are no plans to install a water main on this road.

Staff was directed to review the matter further to provide clarity on financial, engineering and liability concerns. The report was tabled.
