PUBLIC MEETING

1. Zoning By-law Amendment (from "Development-Exception One" to "Residential One-Exception Fifty-Three" and from "Development-Exception One" to "Residential One-Exception Fifty-Four") — Parts 3 and 4 on Plan 49R-13075 on Block 48, Plan 612, Hoffman Subdivision Lands

The Public Meeting was opened by the Mayor at 6:32 p.m. Karen Cronier, Director of Planning and Development, advised that the Notice of Public Meeting had been provided as required under the Planning Act. One written submission was received from Enbridge Inc. who had no concerns regarding the application. No other written submissions were received regarding the application.

Ms. Cronier explained the purpose of the amendment is to rezone Parts 3 and 4 on Plan 49R-13075 in order to permit nine single detached residential lots on the remaining portion of Block 48, Plan 612 of the Hoffman Subdivision Lands. The effect of the amendment is to rezone the subject lands as follows: 1. The five lots to be created from Part 3 on Plan 49R-13075 will be rezoned from Development-Exception One (D-E1) to Residential One-Exception Fifty-Three (R1-E53) to reduce the minimum lot frontage requirement from 18 metres to 17 metres; 2. The four lots to be created from Part 4 on Plan 49R-13075 will be rezoned from Development-Exception One (D-E1) to Residential One-Exception Fifty-Four (R1-E54) to reduce the minimum separation distance from an EMR Zone from 150 metres to 83 metres.

Mayor Sweet asked to hear comments from members of the public. Brian Whitehead of Jp2g Consultants Inc., representing the applicant Dustin Hoffman, spoke in favour of the application. No other public comments were received either for or against the application.

Ms. Cronier then explained the appeal process.

Mayor Sweet declared the Public Meeting closed at 6:36 p.m.
