Zoning By-law Amendment (from "Community Facility (CF)" to "Commercial (C)"),
 Part of Lot 21, Concession 8, Ellard Street, Roman Catholic Episcopal
 Corporation

The Public Meeting was opened by the Mayor at 6:32 p.m. Karen Cronier, Director of Planning and Development, advised that Notice of the Public Meeting had been provided as required under the Planning Act. Written submissions were received from Enbridge Inc. and TransCanada PipeLines Ltd. whom had no concerns regarding the application.

Ms. Cronier explained the purpose and effect of the amendment is to rezone the severed lands in Consent File B35/21 from Community Facility (CF) to Commercial (C) as a condition of consent to permit the severance for a lot addition and to ensure the entire enlarged lot is in the same zone. All other provisions of the Zoning By-law shall apply.

Mayor Sweet asked to hear comments from members of the public. No one from the public came forward to speak for or against the application.

Ms. Cronier then explained the appeal process to those present.

Mayor Sweet declared the Public Meeting closed at 6:34 p.m.

2. <u>Zoning By-law Amendment (from "Rural (RU)" to "Residential One (R1)"), Part of Lot 21, Concession 3, Doran Road, Sherwood Nieman</u>

The Public Meeting was opened by the Mayor at 6:34 p.m. Karen Cronier, Director of Planning and Development, advised that Notice of the Public Meeting had been provided as required under the Planning Act. Written submissions were received from Enbridge Inc. and TransCanada PipeLines Ltd. whom had no concerns regarding the application.

Ms. Cronier explained the purpose and effect of the amendment is to rezone the severed lands in Consent Files B20/21(2), B21/21(3), and B22/21(4) from Rural (RU) to Residential One (R1) as a condition of consent to permit the severance of three residential lots.

Mayor Sweet asked to hear comments from members of the public. No one from the public came forward to speak for or against the application.

Ms. Cronier then explained the appeal process to those present.

Mayor Sweet declared the Public Meeting closed at 6:38 p.m.

Presentations

1. <u>Sustane Technologies – Mayor Tom Peckett, Township of McNab/Braeside</u>

Township of McNab/Braeside Mayor Tom Peckett provided an overview of the waste solution services provided by Sustane Technologies and presented a video produced by the company.

Mayor Peckett explained Sustane Technologies is considering constructing a new recycling plant in McNab/Braeside which would recycle materials and turn them into diesel fuel and biomass pellets among other items. Mayor Peckett indicated the proposed recycling plant could help extend the life of the Upper Ottawa Valley Waste Recovery Centre located in Laurentian Valley, and that the existing landfill could potentially mine its old garbage and send it to the new recycling plant.

Mayor Peckett summarized if the majority of municipalities in Renfrew and Lanark Counties agree to send kitchen waste and recyclables to McNab/Braeside, Sustane Technologies would construct the plant at its own cost possibly within the next two to three years. Mayor Peckett requested Council consider the option of providing its kitchen waste to McNab/Braeside to support the future construction of the plant.

Mayor Sweet, on behalf of Council, thanked Mayor Peckett for his review of Sustane Technologies' waste solution services.
