Planning and Development

1. <u>Activity Report – May 2022</u>

Karen Cronier, Director of Planning and Development, provided an overview of the report. Ms. Cronier highlighted the active subdivisions, Zoning By-law amendments, and developments in pre-consultation. Ms. Cronier reported on site plan applications for apartment buildings on Limestone Trail and at the corner of Highland Park Drive and Civic Centre Road. Ms. Cronier also reported on the reimagining of the former gas station at 3416 Petawawa Boulevard.

3. <u>PL-17-2022 – Development Agreement – Access and Use of Unopened Road</u> <u>Allowance, Kirk and Susan Groover, 24 Leopold Street</u>

Karen Cronier provided an overview of the report.

That Council support an agreement with Kirk and Susan Groover, owners of 24 Leopold Street that will permit the Groover's to continue to access their property over an unopened road allowance and occupy an existing cottage on the subject property while their permanent residence is under construction. The agreement will detail that the demolition of the cottage is to be completed within 90 days of the issuance of the occupancy permit for the new dwelling. **Carried**

4. <u>PL-18-2022 – 1067175 Ontario Inc. (Lance) – Lifting of Part Lot Control – Block</u> <u>49 Plan 49M-89, 11 – 17 Chad Street</u>

Karen Cronier provided an overview of the report. Ms. Cronier reported that the application received from 1067175 Ontario Inc. is to seek exemption from part lot control in order to enable the division of land to create parcels conveyable as separate ownerships for four townhouses.

That Council enact a part lot control exemption by-law with respect to Block 49 on Plan 49M-89, to expire two years from the date of its passing. **Carried**

Public Works

1. <u>Monthly Report – May 2022</u>

David Unrau, Director of Public Works, provided an overview of the monthly report. Mr. Unrau highlighted capital projects to-date, asset management, and special projects. Mr. Unrau reported that Trevor Woodtke, Asset/Energy Management Coordinator, commenced employment on May 9, 2022. Mr. Unrau also reported the Petawawa Boulevard bridge project is scheduled to be completed by the County of Renfrew in mid-October and that the second public meeting for the Petawawa Net Zero project is scheduled for July 11, 2022.

2. <u>PW-17-2022 – Purchase of Traffic Calming Flexible Bollards for Laurentian Drive</u>

David Unrau provided an overview of the report. Mr. Unrau reported on the various speeding concerns that historically have affected Laurentian Drive and the recent speed monitoring statistics that support the speeding complaints. Mr. Unrau highlighted collaboration between the Petawawa Police Services Board, Public Works Department, and County of Renfrew on the introduction and management of traffic calming measures.

That Council of the Corporation of the Town of Petawawa agrees to be financially responsible for 50% of the purchase and installation of approximately 25 traffic calming flexible bollards along Laurentian Drive (County Road 25), and requests the Council of the Corporation of the County of Renfrew contribute the other 50% of the purchase and installation of the traffic calming flexible bollards under its Enhanced Traffic Warning Devices Policy PW-17.

3. <u>PW-18-2022 – Murphy Road Improvements</u>

David Unrau provided an overview of the report. Direction was provided to staff to explore preliminary design and costing options for the urbanization of Murphy Road in partnership with the County of Renfrew.
