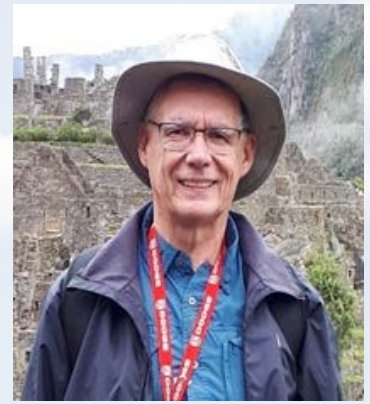

He is one of the founding members of the Pembroke & Area Community Taskforce who started the Warming Centre project for homeless persons in 2023/24. Steve believes strongly that as a member of a community it is important to step up and support the community by giving back. In his spare time Steve makes time for his musical pursuits, playing the guitar, mandolin and piano. He is also an active woodworking hobbyist having built many pieces of furniture for family members and friends. He looks forward to spending time with his grandchildren and enjoys the great outdoors and travelling to new places. Throughout his career Steve has been a strong advocate for the public works sector, and he continues to maintain his memberships in the Renfrew County Roads Supervisors Association (RCRSA) and OACETT. GENERAL TRADESHOW INFORMATION

Location and Dates – The 2026 AORS Municipal Public Works Trade Show will be held at the Petawawa Civic Centre, located at 16 Civic Centre Rd, Petawawa ON K8H 3H5. The Trade Show hours will be from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 3rd and Thursday, June 4th, 2026.

Management – The word “Management” used herein shall mean AORS acting through its officers, directors, committees, agents or employees in the management of the Trade Show.

Opening Ceremonies – 11:00 a.m., Wednesday, June 3rd, 2026 - at the Petawawa Civic Centre

Payment Terms – The cost of the exhibit space must be paid in full by December 31, 2025 to hold the space. Reservations made after December 31 are payable upon confirmation of the reservation. Payments can be made by cheque, money order, credit card (MasterCard or Visa only), or EFT. All payments will be forfeited if space is cancelled after February 28th, 2026. Written cancellations received before February 28th, 2026 will receive a refund less \$100 administration fee.

Liability/Insurance – The 2026 Trade Show Executive Committee representing the Renfrew County Road Supervisors Association and the Association of Ontario Road Supervisors will not be liable for damages resulting to or from your display. Each exhibitor may be required to supply proof of 2 million dollars liability insurance with the Corporation of the Town of Petawawa, the Renfrew County Road Supervisors Association, and Association of Ontario Road Supervisors added as additional insureds for the duration of the Trade Show (Tuesday, June 2nd, 2026 through Thursday, June 4th, 2026).

First Aid – In case of emergency, contact the registration desk. First aid will be available on site.

Rentals – No carpet, chairs or tables will be supplied, but rentals will be available. Order forms will be emailed to all exhibitors prior to the Trade Show. Tent rentals will also be available for outdoor exhibitors

Forklift – Forklift services will be available for inside and outside booths as required. Arrangements for forklift services shall be made in advance with the Trade Show representative(s).

Power Washing – Power Washing Services will be available as required. Arrangements for power washing services shall be made in advance with the Trade Show representative(s). Applicable fees may apply.

Exhibitor's Authorized Representative – Each exhibitor will be required to appoint one individual to represent the company in all dealings with Management. Each company representative will in turn appoint an alternate to act when necessary.

Subleasing of Space – Exhibitors may not sublet neither their space, nor any part thereof or make any arrangements for display by a non-exhibiting company.

Booth Design and Use of Exhibit Space – All indoor booths will have a drapery background, posts, and end and side partitions furnished by Management. Exhibits cannot obstruct the view of other exhibits. No built-up exhibit or other construction shall exceed 7 feet (2 meters) in overall height. In exhibit spaces around the perimeter of the exhibit hall (wall spaces), the background may extend up to, but not exceed 10 feet (3 meters). In the rear two-thirds of each booth, display material of any nature may not exceed 7 feet (2 meters) in height. Overhead canopies or simulated ceilings cannot extend beyond booth space. This rule does not apply to a machine or other piece of equipment on display.

Special Exhibit Provisions – Adhesive-backed decals which may deface any surface of the building may not be distributed. Each exhibitor is asked to recognize the rights of other exhibitors and that general appearance of the show as a whole must take precedence over that of any individual exhibit. The special exhibit provisions will require the co-operation of the exhibitors and designs to maintain and ensure that all displays are in good taste.

GENERAL SHOW INFORMATION continued...

Space Allocation – In the event of conflicts regarding space requests, or conditions beyond its control, the Association of Ontario Road Supervisors reserves the right to revise the booth layouts, including relocation of any and all previously assigned booths. The booth rental fee is for use of the space only. No signage, promotional materials or exhibits may be placed elsewhere on the grounds, outside of the assigned booth space, without prior written permission of Management. While Management makes every reasonable effort to encourage traffic flow to all areas of the Trade Show, it makes no warranty as to the volume of visitors that will visit any particular area or exhibitor, nor the amount of business that an exhibitor will generate as a result of exhibiting. No refunds or damages will be paid to exhibitors who feel they did not experience a sufficient number of visitors to their exhibit or amount of business for whatever reason.

Dangerous Materials (including but not limited to Flammable Materials, Fuels, Generators, and Batteries) – No flammable fluids, substances, or materials of any nature, including decorative materials, use of which is prohibited by national, provincial or municipal fire regulations, may be used in any booth. Automobiles, trucks, tractors, machinery and other vehicles to be displayed may be driven to display area. When positioned, the fuel tank cap shall be secured by locking and/or taping closed. Any use of liquid petroleum compressed gases is prohibited except by written variance from the Fire Chief. Tanks may contain no more than the minimum required for positioning and removal. Battery leads shall be disconnected. Exhibitors are responsible for any damages to the floor or grounds caused by fuel, oils or similar substances. Exhibitors shall remove ignition key and gas tank key. At the conclusion of the Trade Show, after the public has left the venue, all vehicles shall be removed. All curtains, drapes and decorations must be constructed of flameproof materials, or treated with an approved flame proofing solution. Artificial lighting, such as lanterns and candles are prohibited. No drilling of any surface within Trade Show facilities is permitted. Outdoor exhibitors who wish to run a generator for electricity, may only do so with the prior written permission of Management, which is not guaranteed; and if permitted, may be required to relocate so as not to disturb other exhibitors. Equipment or tools equipped with rechargeable batteries shall not be left connected to a power supply for charging outside of Trade Show hours, and only during Trade Show hours as necessary to allow for demonstration of the equipment or tools. Such demonstrations shall only occur in designated areas, and under strict supervision by the exhibitor or their agents. Waivers may be required by both the exhibitor and the visitors testing any equipment.

Exhibitor's Admittance During Non-Show Hours – Representatives of exhibiting companies will not be permitted to enter the exhibit area earlier than one (1) hour before the scheduled opening time each day of the Trade Show. 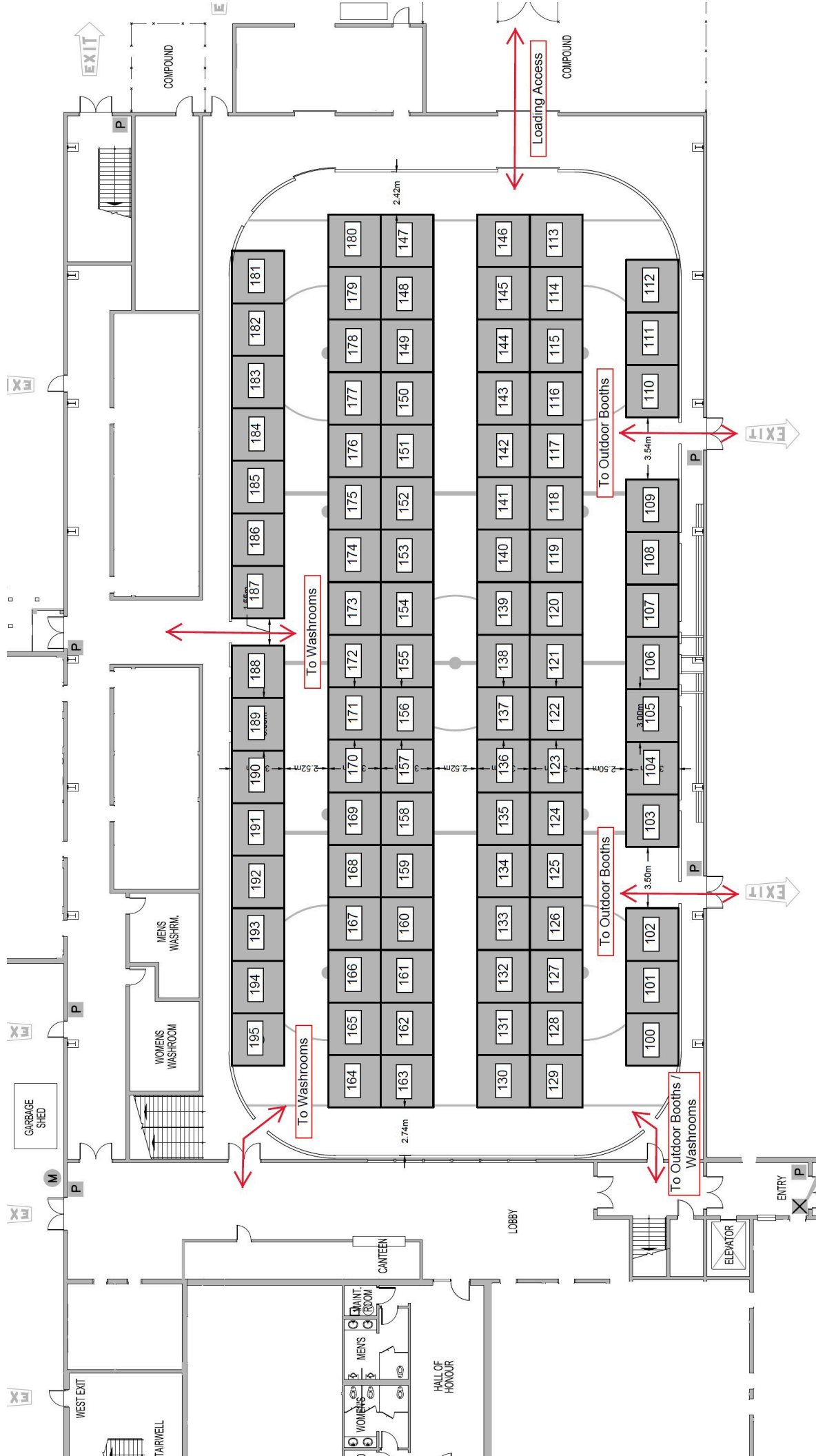

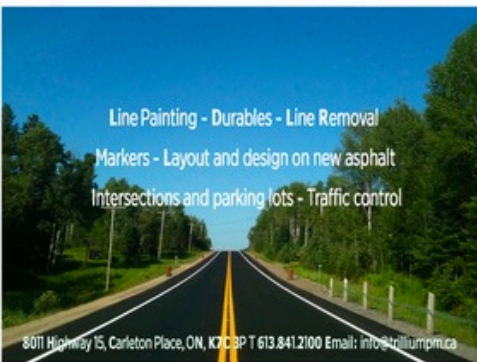

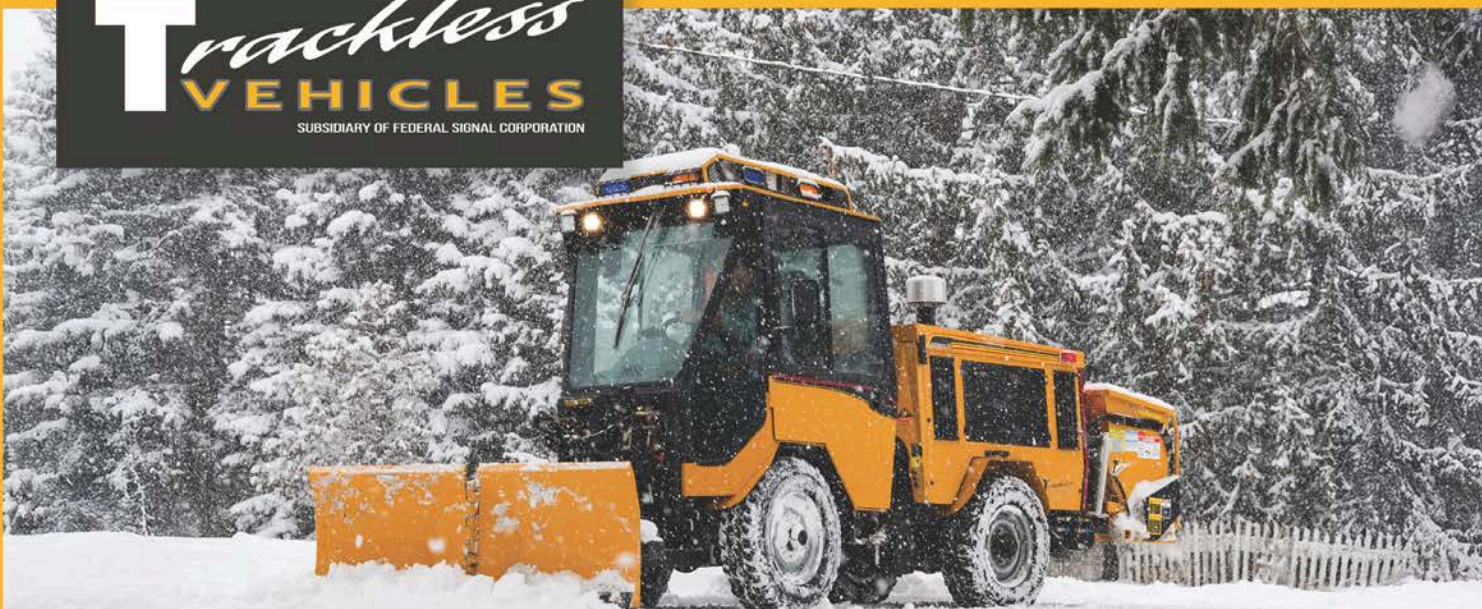

ROSS BECAME THE ROAD SUPERINTENDENT FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF LOBO IN 1974 AND HELD THAT POSITION UNTIL APRIL 1990.

ROSS THEN ACCEPTED THE PART-TIME EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR POSITION FOR THE ASSOCIATION OF ONTARIO ROAD SUPERINTENDENTS WHILE CONTINUING TO BE EMPLOYED AS THE ROAD SUPERINTENDENT FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST NISSOURI. IN MAY 1991, ROSS BECAME THE FIRST FULL TIME EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR AORS UNTIL HIS DEATH IN 1993.

ROSS WAS A GREAT AMBASSADOR FOR THE ASSOCIATION AND MANY OF HIS INITIATIVES WERE INSTRUMENTAL TO THE GROWTH OF AORS THROUGHOUT THE PROVINCE. THOSE OF US WHO WERE FORTUNATE ENOUGH TO KNOW HIM, REMEMBER ROSS FOR HIS HONESTY, SINCERITY, AND SENSE OF HUMOUR, BUT MOST OF ALL AS A TRUE FRIEND. AFTER HIS SUDDEN DEATH, THE FIRST ANNUAL ROSS MCKENZIE GOLF TOURNAMENT WAS ESTABLISHED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE 1994 TRADE SHOW IN OXFORD COUNTY.

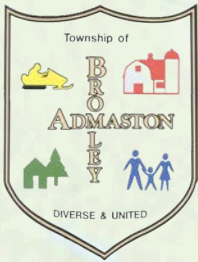
